Maintenance Work on the Tunnel Boring Machine Cecile Drive and Area

As part of maintenance work on the tunnel boring machine (TBM), crews will be lowering the groundwater level at the TBM cutterhead face starting on January 21. The dewatering and maintenance work will take approximately four weeks to complete and is required so that crews can safely change the worn cutterhead tools on the TBM.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- Cecile Drive (west of Highview Place) will remain closed for approximately three to four more weeks. This closure will be in effect 24 hours a day.
- Residents wishing to access Cecile Drive will continue to be detoured south on Clarke Road to Glenayre Drive. Access for residents living at 1030 Cecile Drive will be maintained with the assistance of traffic control personnel.
- Temporary parking restrictions on the south side of Cecile Drive will be in effect.
- Bus stops have been temporarily relocated as part of this closure. Please watch for signs that will indicate the temporary bus stop locations. Pedestrian access on the north side of Cecile Drive will be maintained.
- Fencing will remain while crews lower groundwater levels at the TBM location and conduct additional surveying and geotechnical investigations.
- Noise related to construction activities will include pumps, generators, air compressors, material hauling and the use of heavy machinery and will be in effect from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., Monday through Friday and on Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. Hyrdo-vac and tanker trucks may also be used as part of this process. Crews will work on Sundays only if required.
- Temporary sound-absorbing enclosures will be used to reduce noise from generators and air compressors, which will run continuously overnight to lower the groundwater.
- Groundwater discharge pipes will be temporarily installed adjacent to the roadway on Cecile Drive, Highview Place and Clarke Street.
- All groundwater that is removed will be tested and disposed of in accordance with appropriate authority regulations.
